### Code of Conduct for Parents/Guardians

# <u>Clare Cascaders Basketball Club</u> believes that parents should: -

- Be a role model for your child and maintain the highest standards of conduct when interacting with children, other parents, with officials and organisers
- Never intentionally expose any young participant to embarrassment or disparagement by the use of flippant or sarcastic remarks
- Always recognise the value and importance of the volunteers who provide sporting/recreational opportunities for your child. Do not publicly question the judgement or honesty of referees, coaches or organisers. Respect referees, coaches, organisers and other players.
- Encourage your child to play by the rules. Teach your child that honest endeavour is as important as wining and do all you can to encourage good sportsmanship
- Set a good example by applauding good play on both sides. Encourage mutual respect for teammates and opponents.
- Parents/guardians should support all efforts to remove abusive behaviour and bullying behaviour in all its forms.

#### Parents/Guardians have a right to:-

- · Know their child is safe
- Be informed of problems or concerns relating to their children
- · Be informed if their child is injured
- · Have their consent sought for issues such as trips
- · Contribute to decisions within the club
- Complain if they are concerned about the standard of coaching

# Parent/Guardian Code of Conduct:-

- I will respect the rules and procedures set down in Clare Cascaders Basketball Club Code of Conduct & good practice
- I will respect my child's teammates, leaders, coaches, officials, judges, etc and parents, as well as players, parents and coaches from opposing teams. I will encourage my child to treat other participants, coaches, selectors and managers with respect.
- I will give encouragement and applaud only positive accomplishments whether from my child, his/her team-mates, their opponents or the officials
- I will respect my child's coach(es) and leader(s) and support his/her efforts
- I will respect the officials and their authority during sessions and events
- I will never demonstrate threating or abusive behaviour or use foul language

### **Code of Conduct for Players**

Young people deserve to be given enjoyable, safe sporting opportunities, free of abuse of any kind. These participants have rights, which must be respected, and responsibilities that they must accept. Young people have responsibilities to treat other participants and sports leaders with fairness and respect.

#### Young people are entitled to:-

- · Be treated with dignity and respect
- Experience competition at a level at which they feel comfortable
- · Be safe and feel safe
- · Sav no
- · Get help against bullies
- · Be listened to, and be believed
- · Protect their bodies
- · Have fun and enjoy basketball
- Confidentiality
- · Refuse inappropriate touches
- · Participate on an equal basis

### Young players should always:-

- Treat sports Coaches/Leaders and Officials with respect
- · Play fairly at all times and do their best
- Respect team members, even when things go wrong
- Respect opponents. Shake hands at end of matches
- Abide by the rules set down by Coaches/Leaders when travelling to away events
- Behave in a manner that avoids bringing Clare Cascaders Basketball into disrepute
- Talk to the Child Protection Officer if they have any problems

# Young players should never:-

- Use bad language, harm team members, opponents or their property
- Take property belongings to the club, team mates, or opponents without asking
- Shout or argue with officials, team mates or opponents
- Bully or use bullying tactics to isolate another player
- · Tell lies about adults or young people or cheat
- Keep secrets, especially if they have been caused harm
- · Take banned substances
